Africa Family Adventure; Kenya and Rwanda August 1-10, 2009

You are invited to participate in a thought provoking, challenging and exhilarating summer adventure to East Africa. Known as the “Cradle of Civilization,” East Africa is an extraordinary balance of ancient cultures, wildlife and modernity. Balancing the needs of people and preserving the natural environment is one of Africa’s greatest challenges.

Go “behind-the-scenes” to meet the inspirational social entrepreneurs focusing on HIV/AIDS, innovative recycling and environmental conservation as well as women and youth empowerment and micro-finance. Experience cutting-edge practices to make our world cleaner, environmentally friendly and people economically self-sufficient as well as meet with the leaders and elders of nomadic tribes and hear first-hand their struggles with cultural preservation and modernity.

Specifically designed for families, this experience provides opportunities for you to explore how you can use your gifts and talents to authentically make a difference in the lives of others.

In addition, you will:

- ⇒ **Trek to see the endangered mountain gorilla.** The mountain gorillas share 97% of human DNA and only survive in the volcanic mountain range shared by Uganda, Rwanda and the Democratic Republic of Congo. Only an estimated 500 are left in the wild and unlike the lowland gorilla, the mountain gorilla had never survived in captivity. Learn what is being done (and what still needs to be done) to ensure these magnificent primates survive.
- ⇒ **Go on safari to see the “Big Five” (lion, elephant, leopard, rhino and buffalo) during the legendary and ancient Wildebeest Migration** and learn how laws of nature work in harmony to support several extraordinary eco-systems and the threats Africa’s magnificent wildlife is experiencing due to the encroachment of people and farming.

ITINERARY

August 1: Nairobi

Arrive Nairobi Jomo Kenyatta International Airport. Meet and greet by our representatives and transfer to the luxurious Nairobi Serena Hotel.

August 2-3: Nairobi Site Visits

Spend two days in Nairobi meeting with social entrepreneurs, government and business leaders to experience the “behind the scenes” of the working of the country and better understand the issues, challenges and innovative progress.

Intermixed with site visits, you will also visit the Sheldrick Elephant Orphanage (as seen on the Animal Planet Elephant Diaries) and learn how they rescue orphaned elephants and release them back into the wild.

Overnights at Nairobi Serena Hotel on bed and breakfast basis.

Meal plan: {B}

August 4: Nairobi/Fly Masai Mara – SAFARI “Wildebeest Migration”

08:30hrs Pick up from our hotel and transfer to Wilson Airport for scheduled flight to Masai Mara departing at 10:00hrs and arriving approx 10:45hrs.

Meet on arrival by our host and transfer to Main Governor's Camp with a short game drive en route. Lunch at the camp followed by an afternoon game drive that introduces you to this vast game filled reserve.

Governor's Camp is an exclusive camp located in the prime location to experience the legendary wildebeest migration! In fact, Governor's Camp is often difficult to reserve as the BBC uses the camp as its base for filming the “Big Cats Diary” and the land surrounding the camp is home to one of Africa's largest prides of lions as well as it provides one of the best opportunities to see the elusive leopard!

Governors' Camp, set in one of the most beautiful parts of Africa, provide the old-fashioned pace of life accompanied by the best of 21st century support in the heart of some of East Africa's Prime Wildlife Area. Air services bring you to your camp effortlessly, and ingredients for gourmet meals are flown in daily.

Accommodation is in huge luxury tents in the Masai Mara. Service is personal, attentive and friendly. Security and safety are ensured with constant radio and medical back up.

Governors' Camps are proud to have consistently been recognized with many travel awards and accolades. A Governors' Safari will introduce you to the thrilling pleasures of some of the world's most magnificent wildlife spectacles, pampered in luxury, but in tune with the simply rhythms of life.

Dinner and overnight at the luxury tented camp.

Meal plan: {B, L, D}

August 5-6: On SAFARI

Spend two full days in Masai Mara, Kenya's most popular game sanctuary where you will have the best opportunity of spotting the Big Five - lion, leopard, buffalo, rhino and elephant and track the ancient migration. It is estimated over 1 million wildebeest

migrate each year and you will be in the ideal location for watching the famous river crossing. Three game drives per day by your host. All meals and overnight at Main Governors Camp.

Meal plan: {B, L, D}

August 7: Back to Nairobi/Fly to Rwanda

After a final morning game drive in Masai Mara, we will transfer to the airstrip for our scheduled flight to Nairobi departing approx 11:00hrs and arriving approx 12:15hrs. Lunch will be at the famous Carnivore Restaurant – a Brazilian style meat lovers feast of over nine different game meats! After lunch transfer to the international airport for our scheduled flight to Kigali departing at 18:00hrs and arriving at 18:15hrs.

Meal plan: {B, L}

Meet on arrival by our agent and transfer to Kigali Serena Hotel for overnight stay on Bed and Breakfast basis.

August 8: Kigali/Kinigi

Depart Kigali after breakfast stopping first at the Genocide Memorial and then a visit to the Millennium Village in Rwanda. Founded by Jeffrey Sachs as a sustainable way to alleviate poverty, you will have an opportunity to see first hand how the millennium village concept is transforming lives in this densely populated post-conflict country. If time permits, we will also visit a survivor's village where rape victims of the genocide have created a community to help one another rebuild their lives.

Toward the end of the day, we will drive north of Kigali to Kinigi, enjoying the rolling hills for which Rwanda is well known arriving Gorilla Nest Hotel - the gate-way to Volcanoes National Park (PNV). Tonight we will have an early dinner to rest up for gorilla trekking!

Meal plan: {B, L, D}

August 9: Gorilla Trekking

06:00hrs After an early breakfast transfer to Park Headquarters to track gorillas in Volcanoes National Park. Gorilla tracking through the forest, hills and swamps can be tough, arduous and tiring, sometimes taking anywhere between three to ten hours, depending on the ease with which you locate your gorilla family. Once you find the family, you will spend a full hour coming face to face with the great primate. Following your trek, you will return to the Gorilla Nest Hotel for dinner and overnight.

Meal plan: {B, L, D}

Day 10: Kinigi/Back to Kigali/ USA or Optional Additional Day Gorilla Trekking

If you are leaving today, you will depart for Kigali after breakfast. Time permitting, you can arrange for optional activities and excursions e.g souvenir shopping or city tour. Lunch on own account. Later transfer to the airport for your homebound flight.

If you would like to stay an additional day and trek again for the gorillas, this can be easily arranged at an additional cost.

Meal plan: {B}

Optional Extensions:

Zanzibar – enjoy 3-5 day beach holiday and trek for the indigenous Red Colobus Monkey, found only in Zanzibar as well as snorkel, scuba dive or swim with dolphins in this ancient Muslim spice island.

Kenya or Tanzania – continue your safari experience visiting additional game reserves in either Kenya or Tanzania. The truly adventurous may even want to climb Mount Kilimanjaro!
